
### Shared Strategies

To implement ENGAGE Wraparound Service Coordination to Athens County clustered youth with involvement in children services, juvenile court, or at imminent risk of homelessness

Training of ENGAGE facilitators for Athens County agencies: CSB, DD, JC, substance abuse, mental health, JFS. Facilitators provide service coordination.

8 staff attend 18 hours of ENGAGE facilitator training. Meet monthly and quarterly service planning sessions

ENGAGE facilitators will begin assessing and serving ENGAGE eligible youth, ages 14-21. Targeted number of youth: 23. (enrollment, 6-month, 12-month/discharge evaluation/assessment)

Shared Priorities #1 The Strengthening Families Framework (SFF) was expanded to all early childhood programs in Athens County. COAD became the vendor for OCTF Grant and will no longer be showing up on the Shared Plan for Athens County. COAD is managing the necessary training and support to keep SFF at the root of our local care for Head Start and all other Early Childhood programming in Athens County.

Outcomes: Completion of comparing the PF survey versus the Child Plus Model.  
Identifying Parent Trainers (process continues pending funding-Pool Funding ACFCFC)  
Introduction of Parent Café in Athens County (awaiting facilitator training, funding-Pooled Funding ACFCFC)  
Addition of Parent Survey to Head Start Application (in process)

Strategies: PF Survey distributed with Family Partnership Book (draft period ended March 17, 2015). Approval granted. Partnership Book distributed school year 15-16 Athens County Schools.  
Parent Trainers recruited or positive parenting, first aid/CPR, diet, exercise, physical fitness. Rough draft of a resource directory for parents (May 2015 completed). Recruitment of parents for Parent Café through vendor (COAD) ongoing. Family Partnership book and Child Plus to model each other for 15-16 school year (school collaboration).

COAD became the vendor for OCTF Grant, thus allowing Athens County FCFC the ability to focus on ENGAGE Wraparound Service Coordination to those youth involved with children services, juvenile court, or at imminent risk of homelessness; and other related service coordination.

Ohio MHAS has received a four year Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration System of Care Expansion Implementation grant to support ENGAGE, it's project to engage the new generation to achieve their goals through empowerment. This approach is to expand the system of care approach statewide for youth and young adults in transition ages, 14-21 with serious emotional disturbance and who may have co-occurring disorders.
