



# Columbiana County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan for SFYs 12-16

**Current FCFC Initiatives:** Service Coordination (Wraparound, Information/Referral), Home Choice, Ohio Children's Trust Fund (Parents as Teachers), Parent Advocacy, Help Me Grow, Family Enrichment Project

**The only barriers to providing adequate services to children and families in order to achieve the goals of the Shared Plan are directly related to funding. However, Columbiana County Family and Children First Council Members remain committed to meeting the needs of our community and are working well with the resources that we do have available.**

**The Council has been working to make the goals of the Shared Plan a central focus of their meetings. Outcome measurements for Service Coordination Mechanisms in this county are being developed to measure the effectiveness of our programs in achieving these goals. **4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):**

- Indicator # 1: % of youth surveyed (N=2309) in 7<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades from 10 local schools indicated that 64% of student that they feel actively engaged in learning at their school.
  - Indicator # 2: School Report cards (ODE website) for attendance: attendance rates for 11 school districts during the 2014-2015 school year ranged from 93.2% to 95.6%
  - Indicator # 3: and graduation rates: rates for 11 school districts during the 2014-15 school year ranged from 83.5 to 95.5%
- Some improvement is expected in all three indicators due to initiatives implemented in schools during FY 11. Asset Survey data and ODE report card data for FY 16 will be available in Fall 2016, and comparison data can be reviewed and discussed by FCFC members at that time.

2. Indicator #2: Developmental Assets: A Profile of Columbiana County Youth, 2011-15 (Search Institute) for under-age drinking, and ADAPT (D&A Coalition) survey of local school students will be utilized

Indicator # 1: FY 13 out-of-home placement data to be collected in July 2013 from Juvenile Court, Children’s Services and FCFC Service Coordination for child out-of-home placements

Indicator # 2: Developmental Assets: A Profile of Columbiana County Youth, 2015 (Search Institute) for under-age drinking shows that:

- 16% of youth surveyed (N=2309) in 7<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades from 10 local schools indicated that they used alcohol 3 or more times in the past 30 days or getting drunk once or more in the last 2 weeks; drop from 22% to 16%
- During FY 14, 10 school districts in Columbiana County participated in the Developmental Assets: A Profile of Columbiana County Youth

NOTE: ADAPT (D&A Coalition) survey of local school students will also provide local data regarding underage drinking
