


**The PRIDE Survey is done every other year, so individuals participating in the survey may change (some may not participate for various reasons, while new participants join). Consequently, evaluating same-group results may not reflect a true apples-to-apples comparison. Students are not required to participate in the PRIDE Survey, possibly omitting key data from the results. Although every attempt is made to administer the Survey within the same timeframe in both school districts, scheduling conflicts may prevent this from happening. Administering the Survey at different times of the year may alter students' responses. All data is quantitative; further understanding may be possible from including qualitative data in future Surveys.**
