

**1. Identify any barriers in implementing the plan (i.e. data collection, data tracking, funding, infrastructure, etc.)**

While this work plan has continued in Logan County, lead agency changes have occurred to accommodate the transition of three FCFC Council Directors from 2012-2014. Each of the four shared outcomes were previously led by chairpersons on Results Based Accountability teams (RBA teams) who reported directly to the Council. Due to multiple transitions in FCFC Directors, the RBA teams shifted into newly created or existing community based coalitions (Community CORE, Suicide Prevention Coalition, Healthy Living, and Accesses and Resources Coalition) who became responsible for addressing the priorities listed above. Current administration has reached out to all lead agencies/coalitions in collaboration to build new relationships, update data, and to discuss future methods to collect, track, and analyze data. It is anticipated that in SFY 16, the Shared Plan will be revised and updated to align with the Community Health Improvement Plan and newly identified community needs.

**2. Identify any successes/how implementing this plan has worked to strengthen the council and county collaboration.**

The Council in partnership with Mary Rutan Hospital, Logan Health District, and the Mental Health Board of Logan-Champaign Counties created a local administrative Coalition Advisory Board (CAB) in 2015. The hand-selected membership of the CAB is made up of individuals across sectors who have the ability to influence policy, practice, program, and funding in addition to connect all local coalitions (where the work plans are implemented) to local funding opportunities and to provide access to key stakeholders for the purpose of community change in the shared outcomes sections. This shared planning process and the community health improvement plan will be discussed and reviewed at the CAB (in addition to the Council) to assist with alignment, shared accountability, and shared outcomes. The CAB is currently examining a collective impact data collection system that each of the local coalitions, identified in this document as the "shared outcomes teams" (Healthy People and Behaviors, Stable Families, Young People Succeeding, and Safe and Supportive Neighborhoods) will utilize. In addition, the CAB will be providing countywide Strategic Prevention Framework (SPF) training and technical assistance to the coalitions. While the coalitions had been working for a number of years on this plan, no coalition had been trained in SPF, nor had they utilized a logic model or data tracking system to evaluate for effectiveness. Each coalition recently (SFY16) developed a logic model and strategic/action plan and have an agreed upon common set of data tracking outputs and accomplishments that they will collect and share. This is a first in Logan County- the idea of

common language/common infrastructure for each coalition to work from - we believe it will lead us to demonstrate our ability to have collective impact on the health and wellbeing of Logan County residents.

4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

The Logan County Health District has had significant financial issues and been unable to pass 3 countywide levies in recent years. As a result, some services and staff have been reduced. While an onsite sexually transmitted disease (STD) clinic is not available, the staff at the Logan County Health District have remained committed to making STD education and prevention a priority. All residents seeking STD services are referred to Clark, Allen, or Union county Health Districts. Some of the no-cost investment strategies locally that have made an impact include but are not limited to: condoms are distributed at no cost at the Health District with no age requirement as long as the recipient participates in a brief educational session; a logo campaign promoting STD awareness was held and the winning logo was used to

design cling-on stickers that were distributed at hotels, gas stations, and local doctor offices; and health fairs were held at local manufacturing businesses, social service events, and local correctional facilities promoting education and STD information.

Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

While unemployment has dropped in three years, many families in Logan County are still unable to make a living wage due to high rent costs and low wages resulting in families still needing governmental assistance for food/medical/cash. The number of children living in poverty has a direct relationship to the adult income earners not earning a livable wage. Financial stresses often lead to family crises/instability which increase the likelihood of child abuse and neglect and drug/alcohol abuse. Due to the increase of opiate misuse and heroin addictions and Logan County having a Drug Court specialty docket, Children's Services rates of abuse and neglect have increased. Children's Services and the Logan County Family Court have active members on the Community Opiate Relief Effort (CORE) coalition and the group continues to build strategies toward opiate and child abuse prevention to combat this local and statewide epidemic. Ohio Children's Trust Fund grants will be regionalized and regional needs re-prioritized in SFY17, creating additional local barriers to available services.

Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

The Logan County Drug Free Youth Coalition, a committee of the Logan County FCFC was unable to sustain federal funding from the Drug Free Communities grant in October 2012, which caused the termination of the Coalition Coordinator/40 Developmental Asset trainer. During 2013, the group continued to meet but was unable to find sustainable funding for a coordinator or provide Developmental Asset trainings. Coupled with multiple transitions in the FCFC Director role, the coalition disbanded in 2014 and re-organized into a Coalition Advisory Board for the county in 2015. The work of the Drug Free Youth Coalition was recently spread across other coalitions (C.O.R.E.) with a focus area on

general substance abuse on prevention. Developmental Asset trainings have resumed in one district (in part due to a state Community Connector grant) and Search Institute data collection will continue in 2015.
