


The PAX Good Behavior Game has been implemented in an additional 26 classrooms! This has helped to noticeably reduce the number of spleems (inappropriate/ off task behavior) in classrooms of participating teachers thus increasing the amount of time available for instruction and engagement in the learning process.

In collaboration with superintendents from all school districts in Madison County, the National Youth Behavior Risk Survey was administered in the fall of the 2014-2015 school year.

Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.): It is becoming increasingly difficult for people to obtain a GED because of the changes in testing. The most recent change is from a paper test to an electronic one. The electronic test has a significantly increased math section as well. Instructors are finding they need to teach some individuals the basics of using a computer even prior to taking the test. These changes, coupled with the increase in cost, has driven down the population of people who are taking and passing the GED test.
