

4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):

The most profound data coming from the Community Health Assessment survey was the huge disconnect between what parents thought, or reported their children doing (ie using alcohol, having sex, using drugs) versus what the youth reported actually doing. Interesting though, parents do identify that drug and alcohol use is one of the primary problems in their community. Simply put, although it's a problem, they just do not report that it is happening in their home.

A comparison across data sets from 2007 to 2011 shows that progress is being made in high school use, however additional work is needed with middle school youth. Programming will continue to target both middle and high school youth with identified best practice programming that is culturally sensitive and developmentally appropriate.
