


# Warren County Family and Children First Council Shared Plan for SFYs 12-16

**4. Identify any key findings (explanation of data findings; FCFC actions taken in response to key findings, etc.):**

The percent of children with areas of strength increased by 8% and the percent of children with areas of concerns decreased by 6%. The percentage of children with behavior concerns increased by 5% which is a pattern that has been consistent over several years. The mental

health consultant notes that children with more severe behavioral problems will have a "honeymoon" period in the beginning of the year and behavior may escalate as they feel more comfortable later in the years. Mental health referrals and supports are made for families and the children as needed.
